General Assembly wishes to appoint a United Reformed Church minister to serve as South Western Synod Moderator from 1st October 2023 (or an alternative by agreement).

South Western Synod is seeking a prayerful, discerning and inspirational Moderator to guide the Synod as it looks to fulfil God's mission. The Moderator will help us build on strengths and develop our response to the challenges which are faced both by churches and those who live in our cities, towns and villages.

You will bring to the role your enthusiasm for mission and outreach, desire to promote inclusion and social justice, and advocacy for environmental sustainability. You will have practical experience and an understanding of leading effective change in complex situations. You will have a vibrant interest in ecumenical and interfaith relationships.

Your interpersonal, management, communication and digital skills will help you to lead a Synod which covers a region of varied communities from rural and seaside villages to towns and cities, with many churches in ecumenical partnerships and some in united areas. The Synod is committed to encouraging and supporting its 110 churches in mission to their local communities and beyond.

You will bring experience in innovative, mission focused, ministry in local churches, to support and encourage our churches to be authentic, outward looking, and rooted in their local community. everyone in the URC Learning Hub – Click here to access Exploring Eldership




publishes weekly lectionary-based resources: these include topical sermon ideas, weekly outlines for intergenerational worship services, and resources for children's and youth groups.

LEGACIES OF SLAVERY



EPC REGULATION CHANGES FOR COMMERCIAL PROPERTY LETTINGS FROM 1 APRIL 2023

We, as landlords, should prepare for the next round of EPC regulations coming into force on 1 April 2023 as part of the government's push to achieve net zero emissions by 2050.

2018 saw the Minimum Energy Efficiency Standards (MEES) come into force which brought about the requirement that no new tenancy be created without the property having an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) rating of E.

From the 1 April 2023, this requirement will tighten so that all tenanted commercial properties will have to achieve an E rating or less on their EPC, regardless of whether the tenancy is new.

On the grant of a new lease the EPC must be available at the outset with a minimum rating of E as the law stands at present – rising to a minimum of C for all new leases granted from 2025 onwards and with the added requirement that the rating for pre 2025 leases is raised to a minimum of C by 2028 (unless one of the statutory exemptions can be relied upon).

As the Trust & Property Officer I am aware this might have significant implications for many of our churches relying heavily on their rental income to support them.

We at the Synod are encouraging local churches to apply for Eco Grants and of course our Green Apostles are also there to help too.
