
As we hurtle towards the end of August it is time for a catch up. What has been happening, what is current and what is coming up.

RECONNECT!: a URC event for 20-40s

We are delighted to be hosting the first URC event for those in their 20s-40s, generously funded by the URC's Discipleship Development Fund.

Reconnect! is a discipleship event with worship, Bible study, panel discussion and small-group discussions. It aims to provide a space for 20-40 year olds to make connections with other Christians, to share in fellowship, and to discuss church life and faith in the context of life in this age bracket. We are hoping to establish an ongoing supportive network that will nourish people in their everyday discipleship and local church life.

Who is this for? Anyone in their 20s-40s who is connected with or interested in the URC, particularly those who have recently left Youth Assembly and those who do not have much contact with a local URC.

When will it be? Saturday 16th September 2023 with the option of staying over from 6pm the night before (Friday 15th) if you are coming from a distance.

Where will it take place? At Westminster College in Cambridge, one of the URC's Resource Centres for Learning.

Why is it happening? The report from the 20-40s task group to General Assembly in 2018 explored the reasons for the lack of 20-40 year olds in traditional churches and emphasised the need to walk ogether in community. Lack of engagement with traditional church is not a problem that needs fixing, out rather a call to find new ways forward together.

econnect! will be an opportunity for those in their 20s-40s to worship and socialise together, but also to think together about future discipleship and fellowship events and how the URC might better support and encourage those in this age-group.




GRANTS AVAILABLE FOR CHURCHES IN WILTSHIRE

FUNDING SUPPORT FOR CHARITIES HELPING VULNERABLE PEOPLE

Charities and community organisations working with vulnerable people are being invited by the Government to apply for a share of a Department of Culture, Media and Sport support package.

The fund will support frontline charities and community organisations providing services such as the provision of food, emergency provisions, shelter, safe spaces, warmth and financial or housing advice. Organisations can apply for grants worth between £10,000 and £75,000 to cover project and core costs, including office rent, utilities, staff and volunteers, from now until the end of March.

QUINQUENNIAL SURVEYS (QS) & PROPERTY GRANTS

Just a reminder from the Property Team here at the Synod Offices.

It is best practice to have a QS every 5 years, carried out by a professional independent building surveyor. We have recommendations at Synod if you need help finding someone suitable. The QS will look at every part of the property and provide you with a comprehensive 5 year maintenance plan.

Synod will, upon receipt of the invoice and a copy of the QS, provide you with 50% of the costs of the QS.

Once you have the maintenance plan there may be thins you need to do urgently to the buildings or in some cases larger issues need to be tackled. The Property Team can help with property grants. Just email either myself or Colleen on property@urcsouthwest.org.uk for information and an application form.

You might be able to claim a 50% Face Lift Grant (25% for an LEP) up to the project/ item value of £20,000 (so in effect we would give you up to £10,000 (£5,000 for an LEP) for the project). These can be applied for every 5 years and are a great tool when planning your 5 year maintenance repairs for your building.

We also have 10% Property Grants (5% for an LEP) and Eco Grants.

Just pop us an email and we will help in whatever way we can... And remember a QS and various property grants are not just for churches but also for manses and any other buildings you may have too.

We look forward to hearing from you with your applications and QS surveys.






