

200TH ANNIVERSARY OF PORTSCATHO UNITED CHURCH

2022 is, of course, the 50th anniversary of the URC, however one of our smaller churches is celebrating an even older anniversary. There has been a worshipping community in the chapel at Portscatho, a small Cornish village on the Roseland peninsula for 200 years! The story begins when William Billings, a master

seiner in the pilchard industry, arrived in Portscatho to continue his work as a fisherman and to further his vision to establish a religious group promoting non-

conformity in the village, and so in 1822 Portscatho Independent Congregation was founded. Christians had already been worshipping in people's houses for several years before the purposebuilt chapel was erected. William was ordained in 1825 and continued to serve the congregation until his early death in 1839. The congregation prospered and the current building was opened in 1867.



One fascinating snippet of history tells us that disaster struck the community in the great blizzard of 1891 - the church secretary died at sea when his schooner sank. For some bizarre reason he had taken all the church records with him for safe keeping! They were lost!

In 1972 the chapel became part of the URC and so 2022 is a double celebration. In 1986 Portscatho URC started to worship with Gerrans Methodist congregation, and this led to them becoming an LEP in 1990. As a United church they have continued worshipping together ever since.

The chapel sits right on the Southwest Coast Path, and it was decided to offer coffee



and a place to rest (donations welcome) to any weary walkers or other holiday makers. The members, though few, are committed to this work and see it as outreach in the community. Judging from the comments in the visitors' book they are succeeding in William Billings's original vision.

On Sunday 25th September the church held a celebration service; the preacher was Revd Lorraine Mellor, the newly appointed Chair of the Cornwall and Isles


of Scilly Methodist District. It was lovely to see many old friends and meet new ones. Being Cornwall, the service ended with a cream tea!
