Synod Moderator Nomination process

The Synod Executive Committee and Trust Officers of the South Western Synod and the Officers of General Assembly, have released the following statement:

A process took place to nominate a candidate as Moderator of the South Western Synod for the Officers of the General Assembly to confirm on behalf of the General Assembly. This resulted in a nomination but shortly after the process was complete, a complaint was raised about the process by a panel member. An independent investigation followed which took some time to conclude due to the need to hold conversations with all involved. As a result of that investigation, and various issues that were raised about the process, within and beyond the Synod, the Officers of the General Assembly determined they could not with confidence accept the nomination that had been made.

Representatives of the Officers of the General Assembly met with the Synod Executive on 26th September, and together we have reflected on what needs to be learned from the experience and the investigation report. We know that this is a very difficult situation for all concerned and also that it adds very great pressure for many people within and beyond the Synod. We deeply regret that we are where we are. Together, we are now working towards a new process that will allow us to discern a nomination with confidence.

It is our hope that it will be possible for an advert to appear in the issue of Reform that will be circulated in late January. The Synod Executive is taking steps to support and sustain Synod staff and the wider life of the Synod during this extended vacancy. We ask for your understanding that much of the detail of this situation must remain confidential and that no concerns were raised at all about the candidates who were interviewed, and they have been encouraged to reapply.

It is never easy in Church life when things go wrong, but it is important that when they do, it is acknowledged and put right. The Officers of the General Assembly and the Officers of the Synod apologise that whilst we work to ensure the process is run with confidence, the Synod will remain without a Moderator for longer than we all might have hoped. We ask for your prayers and encouragement for all who have been involved in the process to date, and for all who will serve in the next phase of seeking a nomination.

Just Economics



Spring 2024 Holy Land Pilgrimage

Revd. Paul Snell, County Ecumenical Officer for Devon and a URC Minister, and his wife Linda, are leading another pilgrimage to the Holy Land Israel/Palestine from 3rd – 11th April 2024, and invite you to join them.

This trip will includes all the major biblical sites associated with the ministry of Jesus including a visit to the Dead Sea, Ein Gedi the Jesus Trail, Jaffa (Joppa), Mount Carmel and a special sound and light show at Beth Shean. A good standard hotel accommodation - 1 night in Bethlehem followed by 4 nights in East Jerusalem and 3 nights in Tiberius overlooking the Sea of Galilee. There will be time for quiet reflection and we will share the experience of fellowship with other pilgrims as we travel in our own coach accompanied by our own local guide. The cost based on half board and 2 people sharing is £2281 which includes flights from Heathrow.
