2023 HOLY LAND VISIT


Each outlining the journey of faith that had lead them to explore a calling to lead worship and preach they shared their testimonies with the

WHAT DO YOU THINK?

Event for General Assembly attendees who are under 26 years old

The 'What Do You Think?' (WDYT) event is held immediately before General Assembly - normally a residential from Wednesday lunch time to Friday lunchtime inclusive, with General Assembly then starting after lunch on Friday.

What Do You Think is an opportunity for the under 26 reps to General Assembly (GA) to get together before GA to explore the Book of Reports and to prepare for the business of GA. There is also an opportunity to join some sessions over zoom for those not able to attend in person. People are automatically invited once the roll of members of General Assembly has been agreed.

This is a great opportunity to get your head around all things General Assembly, practice using the technology and taking part in discussions, and get to know the other under 26 reps. There will be time for fun and fellowship as well, and lots of lovely meals!

The purpose of WDYT? is to help you, the under 26 reps, prepare for GA. To do this we will:

- learn a little about the structures of the URC, its governance and the work of the standing Committees;
- look at how GA works and how business will be conducted online this year, using the different voting systems etc;
- spend time on the reports, clarifying our understanding of their content and discuss the reports themselves;
- look at our participation in GA speaking in the discussions, suggesting and writing amendments, protocol, etc.

Regarding funding, WDYT costs will be paid for by the General Assembly. The Children's and Youth Office will sort all arrangements. All meals during WDYT will be catered for. Travel to WDYT will need to be claimed back from your Synods. If this is likely to cause any difficulties, please let us know.

THE UNITED REFORMED CHURCH WALDENSIAN FELLOWSHIP

The URC Waldensian Fellowship is planning a visit to the Waldensian Church in Italy, to take place in the period from 4th to 18th May, 2023.

The visit will be based in comfortable and well situated Church Centres in two areas of Italy. The programme for the visit is as follows:

Part 1. A week in the historic Waldensian Valleys in the Cottian Alps, west of Turin, visiting historic sites set in dramatic alpine scenery;

Part 2. Four days at a Waldensian Centre on the Ligurian coast, a few miles from the French border, where we will see something of the Waldensian Church's witness in wider Italian society.

We would be delighted if you were interested in joining us!

It is possible to join the group for the entire visit, or for one or other of the two parts.

Total cost of the visit (excluding travel to and from Italy) will be around £750.

Part One of the visit on its own would cost £400 and Part Two would cost £350.
