CELEBRATING OUR SYNOD!

We have agreed to a different and very special Synod meeting on **Saturday 21st October**. We'll meet from 9:45am-3:15pm at Westfield URC, Bridgwater. Essential Synod business will be limited to time in the afternoon. The bulk of the day will be devoted to Making Christ Known – our explorations of tools and resources to help congregations seek, serve and share Christ in our communities.

We are opening this gathering to up to 10 from each church. We want to share with a wider cross section of Synod in celebration (travel expenses can be reclaimed from the Synod for all attending, but please share transport as much as possible).

The heart of this synod gathering will be workshops. We are delighted that several churches have offered to run workshops sharing resources for mission, worship and outreach that they have recently used.

RECONNECT!: a URC event for 20-40s

Saturday 16th September 2023, 10am-4.30pm

Westminster College, Cambridge

We are delighted to be hosting the first URC event for those in their 20s-40s, generously funded by the URC's Discipleship Development Fund.

Reconnect! is a discipleship event with worship, Bible study, panel discussion and small-group discussions. It aims to provide a space for 20-40 year olds to make connections with other Christians, to share in fellowship, and to discuss church life and faith in the context of life in this age bracket. We are hoping to establish an ongoing supportive network that will nourish people in their everyday discipleship and local church life.

Who is this for? Anyone in their 20s-40s who is connected with or interested in the URC, particularly those who have recently left Youth Assembly and those who do not have much contact with a local URC.

When will it be? Saturday 16th September 2023 with the option of staying over from 6pm the night before (Friday 15th) if you are coming from a distance.

Where will it take place? At Westminster College in Cambridge, one of the URC's Resource Centres for Learning.

Why is it happening? The report from the 20-40s task group to General Assembly in 2018 explored the reasons for the lack of 20-40 year olds in traditional churches and emphasised the need to walk together in community. Lack of engagement with traditional church is not a problem that needs fixing, but rather a call to find new ways forward together.

Reconnect! will be an opportunity for those in their 20s-40s to worship and socialise together, but also to think together about future discipleship and fellowship events and how the URC might better support and encourage those in this age-group.



FUNDING SUPPORT FOR CHARITIES HELPING VULNERABLE PEOPLE

Charities and community organisations working with vulnerable people are being invited by the Government to apply for a share of a Department of Culture, Media and Sport support package.

The fund will support frontline charities and community organisations providing services such as the provision of food, emergency provisions, shelter, safe spaces, warmth and financial or housing advice. Organisations can apply for grants worth between £10,000 and £75,000 to cover project and core costs, including office rent, utilities, staff and volunteers, from now until the end of March.

Applications will be accepted until 16 October 2023. Further details on eligibility and the applications process can be found on The National Lottery Community Fund website, in its role as the intermediary grant maker.

A FEW OF THE SUMMER ACTIVITIES AROUND THE SYNOD

CANNINGTON HOLIDAY CLUB

On our first day we introduced the children to our 'Watery World' sharing the story of God's creation and taking part in all manner of 'Watery' activities.

We made water filters, worked together to make a water drop maze without any 'leaks,' made rain drops and played a game to score points by getting our rain drops in the hoop and made rain gauges from

milk bottles to observe the amount of rainfall in our local area. We talked about



the impact of this on food production and access to drinking water for children across the globe.

On day 2 we continued to explore God's Creation Day 3 was 'Family Folk' and we talked about the 'Good Samaritan' we had a short sketch by the adults at the start of the day. We invited families to stay to lunch at the end of the holiday club session.



WESTFIELD URC – SUMMER CLUB

For 1 week during the 6 weeks holidays Staff and Volunteers at Westfield URC hosted a Free summer club,

open to all children. attended by an and gave them the new skills.

The aim of the holiday club was to produce a mini show in a week.

It ran for 3 hours per day, was average of 38 children each day opportunities to learn many

On day one we introduced the children to the story of Joseph and his Coat of many colours. We prepared slides for the children to read and learnt a variety of songs to illustrate the story.

Throughout the week we added more songs and dances and introduced the microphones, until we had learnt all we needed for our show.




RECORD BREAKERS HOLIDAY CLUB OTTERY ST. MARY

Each day we had well over 30 children attend. We also had a number of young leaders this year, aged 12-13 years, who made such a difference in helping and leading the children. During the week we looked at the stories of Noah, Jonah, Samson and Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. Each day we also did a craft

linked to the story. In the main tent we looked at the various themes in the stories and how they can apply to us. For instance with Noah I looked at God's promises and how he keeps them and for Jonah I looked at the topic of Mercy. Final day saw us do a Holiday Club Celebration Service. This is where we showed



the parents what we had been doing, sang some of the songs we had learnt and also did a few record breaking attempts. The adults that attended seem to enjoy it. At the end we gave every child a Record Breaker Medal. After the celebration we all stayed for a BBQ.
